Just to get it all in one place, here are some things Snow and I discussed in our reflections on this project:

1. It would benefit everyone to start the projects like this:

Day 1 - introduce projects, explain requirements, get everyone a topic (and a group, if necessary), get them started on brainstorming ideas, show examples of good weeblys

Day 2 - come to library - review research ideas (getting started, good sources), have them create an OUTLINE

Day 3 - library - mini lesson on websites - intro to weebly - continue research - get outline okayed by teacher

Days 4 and 5 - library - put information into website, following outline

2. we can create an online evaluation tool for:

a. students to critique classmates' websites

b. students to review group members' contributions (if groups are used)

It would also be a good idea to review the issue of time management when starting this project. It's not like they are ONLY allowed to work on this IN school - if they have internet access, they should spend time on it outside of class too. And they are encouraged to utilize study halls and academic periods to gain valuable extra time to make this happen. Creating websites and building digital literacy is an important life skill, as are developing research skills, creating and conveying an effective message, and using the internet ethically -- they do all of this within this project.
